Security Classification: This course/lesson will present information that has a Security Classification of: U - Unclassified.

a. Review the Fundamentals of the Offense

- (1) Cover and Concealment. Cover is anything natural or man-made that will protect a Trainee from smallarms enemy fire. Natural cover includes such things as logs, trees, stumps, ravines, and hollows. Man-made cover includes such things as fighting positions, trenches, walls, rubble and craters. Concealment is anything that hides you from enemy observation. Natural concealment includes such things as bushes, grass, trees, and shadows. If possible, natural concealment should not be disturbed. Man-made concealment includes such things as Army uniforms, camouflage nets and natural material that have been moved from its original location.
- (2) Suppressive Fire. Suppressive fire is the placement of a heavy volume of fire on the enemy to keep his head down while your buddy moves to the next covered position. Without the suppressive fire to pin the enemy, your buddys chance of reaching his/her next covered position is greatly reduced.
 - (3) Movement.
- (a) The low crawl gives you the lowest silhouette. Use it to cross places where the concealment is very low and where enemy fire or observation prevents you from getting up.
- (b) The high crawl lets you move faster than the low crawl and still gives you a low silhouette. Use this when there is good concealment but enemy fire prevents you from getting up.
- (c) The rush is the fastest way to move from one position to another. Each rush should last 3 to 5 seconds to keep the enemy from tracking you. Also, you can combat roll to the opposite side you are firing around to distract the enemy.
- (4) Teamwork. Trainees must work as a team and give the proper commands to effectively and safely negotiate the live-fire course.
- (a) Upon the command of "Move," the two-man team will sound off with "Contact" and then rush to their first position.
- (b) Once they get to their position, one Trainee will use suppressive fire while the other Trainee gives the command of "Cover me while I move." The other man will say, "I have you covered."
- (c) The Trainee places the weapon on safe, indentifies the next temporary fighting position with cover and / or concealment, and uses proper individual movement techniques.
- (d) Once the Trainee arrives at his next position, he/she will sound off with "In position." Once the Trainees buddy hears that command, the buddy will issue the same commands as the Trainee and perform all steps as above.
- (e) Once both Trainees reach their last position, they will throw the grenade from the best suitable position. One Trainee will throw while the other covers him. The command will be "Cover me while I throw my grenade," the Trainees buddy will say, "I got you covered."
 - (f) The Trainee assumes the proper position, throws their grenade, returns to the last covered and

concealed position, and sounds off with "Frag Out!" After that, the Trainees buddy will do the same.

(g) Each Trainee will wait for the grenade to explode and then go "Green." After completing the Buddy Team LFX, the Trainees will return to the start point for AAR.

- (3) Small-arms simulator (if available) should open fire immediately after Trainees begin their forward movement.
- (4) Upon being fired on, the Trainees should immediately take cover, return fire if a target(s) can be observed directly to their front, and then begin their fire and maneuver toward the objective. The exercise will end once Trainees engage target(s) with a practice hand grenade.
- (5) Once grenades have exploded, Trainees will go "Green" and be directed off the course to attend an AAR.
